


On Friday October 20, 2023, our co-founder and Legal Director, Camerina Zorrozua, was recognized along with several other community members for their advocacy and action in response to unlawful bus boardings and interrogations by CBP at our local Greyhound bus station.

Latinos En Spokane hosted their fundraiser and film premiere of "The Immigration Resident." This documentary, created in partnership with "On The Horizon Films," captures the realities Latinos live through to overcome an unjust immigration system, a global pandemic, political division, and systemic barriers to justice. COMMUNITY PARTNER HIGHLIGHT!




Dia de los muertos
